

# UNITED STATES STATE PROJECT:

You have been assigned a (2) state(s) to investigate. As part of your project you will need to find information about your state. You are not limited to the following, but should include:

1. Map of the state which includes major physical features (such as rivers, lakes mountains, swamps, everglades, national parks, coast line or bordering states, etc)
2. Map of the state which includes the capital and major cities and tourist attractions.

Information about your state should include 1-10 but is not limited to:

1. State size
2. State song
3. Governor
4. Population
5. History (when did state become a state)
6. Climate (any records set)
7. State seal,
8. State flower, bird, tree, gem, symbol, sport, fish, etc.
9. State flag
10. State nick name
11. Origin of state name
12. Major colleges or universities
13. Wildlife
14. Customs, food or origin of immigrants but should include the number of representatives and names of the US Senators.
15. Sports or sports teams

Your project must include at least two outline maps on which you have given information. You must use color on you maps, legend and title.

You **MAY NOT** copy a map you found on the internet that includes the information. You must put the information in yourself. Turning in information that is already completed will result in a zero for this project.

You may list all information in report form typed or hand written in black or blue pen or you may list all information on a poster board.

Please list all websites or books you have used that I have not listed or are not classroom books. I will provide a map of each state for you.
